

<u>Volunteers of Legal Service – Immigration Project</u> Summer 2025 Internship

Organizational Mission

For 40 years, VOLS has partnered with New York City's leading law firms and companies as well as community-based organizations to help close the access to justice gap for low-income New Yorkers. VOLS provides free, civil legal services to New Yorkers with limited resources, including older adults, veterans, individuals entitled to public benefits, immigrant youth, children and their families, mothers in prison or jail, and small business owners. Last year, VOLS assisted clients on more than 4,000 legal matters, and our services benefited over 6,400 individual New Yorkers. VOLS' staff of 22, including 15 attorneys and law graduates, works with volunteers from over 80 law firms/companies to exponentially increase our impact. We partner with 150 community groups to ensure that our services are accessible and address local needs.

VOLS strives to build and retain a diverse and inclusive team, and we actively seek a diverse candidate pool. We strongly encourage candidates who have had lived experience in the communities we serve.

Project Overview:

The VOLS Immigration Project offers support for immigrant students and young adults to help them pursue higher education, employment, and permanent residency so that they can pursue their dreams and advocate for themselves, their families, and the community. The Immigration Project is a leader in building trusted relationships with educators and staff at public schools by providing ongoing training to identify and address immigration-related legal issues. The Project also works with community-based organizations, helping their constituents understand and resolve their immigration issues.

Internship Description:

The intern will allow VOLS to expand our current capacity to help immigrant youth and their families. The intern will: 1) Conduct intakes for clients; 2) follow-up with client during the intake and review process; 3) provide counsel and advice to clients under attorney supervision; 4) help develop new and refine existing training materials for our volunteer attorneys; and 5) help develop new and refine existing public facing outreach materials. Spanish language skills strongly preferred.
