## The VOLS Model

The VOLS Model begins by identifying pressing civil legal issues affecting New Yorkers. We structure our programs, staff, and pro bono resources around these needs. Our approach is continually refined through feedback and guidance from the communities we serve, ensuring our efforts effectively address our clients' civil legal challenges. We are a Pro Bono First Organization – every VOLS project and initiative is designed to maximize support for our clients by incorporating pro bono volunteers from private law firms and companies. **That's how one VOLS attorney becomes many**. We can take more cases, serve more New Yorkers, and tap into more resources for our clients than we could through our nonprofit staff alone.

#### **Pro Bono First**

VOLS works with 83 law firms and companies. We connect and support an active network of 1,800 pro bono volunteers who take cases, make community legal education presentations, and help develop up-to-date materials.



#### **Our Team**

VOLS' team provides direct civil legal services and recruits, trains, and mentors pro bono volunteers. The team provides accessible community legal education and training.



#### **Community Partnerships**

VOLS works with schools, hospitals, older adult centers, community-based organizations, and New York City and State government officials to support our clients. We collaborate on community legal education, identify emerging legal trends and community members in need of support.



## More than a Case: A New Yorker

### Sadik Topia Back in Business

VOLS Microenterprise Project and probono partner Davis Polk & Wardwell LLP assisted Sadik Topia, a newsstand owner who had served his Upper West Side community for years. With his team's passionate advocacy and legal support, Sadik navigated complex regulations and legal challenges. It was a neighborhood celebration when he obtained a new license and retained his family's livelihood. Thanks to free legal services from VOLS MEP and our probono partners, Mr. Topia's newsstand is back in business.

## More than a Case: TP's Story

Incapacity and life-planning provides critical legal protections for older adults and tremendous relief as they navigate life's changes.

VOLS Senior Law Project received a call from TP, an older adult client suffering from gangrene and the declining use of his voice. He urgently needed life planning documents as his health was rapidly declining. TP was determined to make sure his wishes were clearly documented, that his family would be protected in the event of his incapacity or death, and that his chosen caregivers appointed. With the help of his ex-wife, who continues to care for him, we worked closely to understand TP's wishes and prepare the necessary life planning legal documents. Our team took particular care to ensure accurate communications, since TP was unable to speak or write.

Once the documents were ready, our entire team visited his nursing home in the Bronx to complete the signing, with witnesses, a notary, and a physical signer on his behalf. The finalized documents gave TP a tremendous sense of relief, helped protect his ex-wife and children, and ensured his affairs would be handled according to TP's wishes.



## More than a Case: An Impact

#### **Markey Decision**


What happens when a New Yorker is forced to sue the government in order to enforce their rights - and wins? Our client Peter Markey, a disabled Navy veteran, sued New York State in 2023 after his application for rental assistance was denied. Soon after filing that lawsuit, the State approved Mr. Markey's benefits. But despite forcing Mr. Markey to take legal action in order to rightfully obtain his benefits, the State insisted it would not cover his legal fees to do so. This year, thanks to the work of VOLS Benefits Law Project and a phenomenal pro bono team at Orrick Herrington & Sutcliffe LLP, a New York Appellate Court unanimously decided to close a critical legal loophole so that everyday New Yorkers can recoup attorney fees in prevailing lawsuits against the state. The Third Department held that plaintiffs in an Article 78 proceeding may be awarded attorney fees if they are a prevailing party even without a court ruling — under the "catalyst theory" within the New York Equal Access to Justice Act. This is a victory for access to justice with significant implications for all New Yorkers seeking to enforce their rights.

## Ending Discriminatory Practice in Article 17-A Guardianship Applications

VOLS Senior Law Project in collaboration with probono partner Linklaters LLP successfully challenged unlawful and discriminatory practices in Queens County's Article 17-A Guardianship procedures. As a result, immigrant families will no longer face an unnecessary barrier when seeking to lawfully care for their adult disabled children.

## **Group Entity Representation**

VOLS Microenterprise Project represented a Brooklyn-based Merchant Association in their effort to gain tax-exempt status under 501(c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Merchant Association's mission is to support its members, provide goods and services, share resources, encourage commercial district activity, create job opportunities, and raise awareness for the commercial district's growth. The neighborhood has over 326 small businesses and is projected to generate about \$2.6 billion by 2027. This work impacts the entire neighborhood served, nearly 88,000 residents.



## **VOLS** Senior Law Project

VOLS Senior Law Project (SLP) helps low-income older adults make key legal decisions for incapacitation, end-of-life, and posthumous care. Through our life planning services, we help older adults identify what they need and draft and execute their documents and directives, so they can have control over their medical and financial futures.



#### **MM's Story**

VOLS' client MM is an older adult living with stage 4 cancer and is hard-of-hearing. When MM felt it was time to draft her key life planning documents, her social worker reached out to VOLS. Understanding the client's needs, and the complexity of her health conditions, VOLS SLP planned a tailored approach. Our team worked with MM over the course of three months, holding weekly phone calls with the assistance of her social worker, to draft her life planning documents. When the time came to finalize and execute MM's documents, VOLS SLP's attorneys traveled to her home in Brooklyn -a meaningful day that provided our client with much needed peace of mind and protection for the future..

VOLS Benefits Law Project (BLP) helps New Yorkers more equitably access essential public benefits that help meet basic needs including Unemployment Insurance, New York Rent Freeze Programs (SCRIE/DRIE), and a range of housing-related public benefits. We assess eligibility, appeal denials, and other issues, and assist with applications, renewals, and recertifications.



## **VOLS Benefits Law Project**

VOLS stands up for New Yorkers when wrongful denials threaten access to the critical benefits they need and deserve.



~135,111 households were eligible for the NYC Rent Freeze Program [in 2019], with only 75,515 actually receiving benefits.

#### DG's Story

VOLS' client DG is a disabled, low-vision tenant living alone in southern Brooklyn, struggling to afford the rent of his longtime apartment. In spring 2025, he applied for a rental assistance benefit called the Disability Rent Increase Exemption (DRIE). Despite meeting all of the program requirements, the city refused to approve his application, claiming he failed to provide enough documents and accusing him of misrepresenting his income. DG reached out to VOLS, despondent and afraid. VOLS immediately intervened, visiting DG in his home, assisting DG to secure additional documents impossible for him to access on his own, and challenging the city's assessment of his income. The city reconsidered his application and approved DG for DRIE and retroactive benefits due to their delay. Without VOLS, DG would have most definitely lost his chance at this benefit, but he now has a clear pathway to remain in his home.

## **VOLS Immigration Project**

VOLS Immigration Project (IP) provides free immigration legal services to young people and their families that support their security and education and employment opportunities. Our model is designed to adapt to the evolving needs of the immigrant community, ensuring we're prepared to address changes as they develop.

31% of all students enrolled in higher education were first and second-generation immigrants





#### **AD's Story**

Fostering relationships with our young immigrant clients is key to providing the support they need and deserve. The immigration legal system can be extremely challenging—even a single missed hearing can cost someone their status and result in their removal from the United States. Such was the case for AD, a teenager applying for Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS), a form of protection for immigrant youth who have been abused, abandoned, or neglected by one or both parents. One missed hearing put in place an order for him to be removed from the United States, which would have created catastrophic consequences for this young man. Assigned to this complex case, VOLS IP's team was persistent. We successfully argued for the removal order to be overturned. Now, AD has an approved SIJS petition and can remain in the country, putting him on the path to becoming a lawful permanent resident. As they work on the final step of ending AD's removal proceedings, AD and his pro bono attorneys remain close. When AD graduated from high school this year, his lawyers were in the audience, cheering on his future.

## VOLS Microenterprise Project

VOLS Microenterprise Project (MEP) provides transactional legal services to new and existing low- to moderate-income small business owners and acts as a vital resource through our community legal education workshops and clinics to provide legal information on emergent issues.

Rouguiatou Diallo is the founder of SLM, an up-and-coming beauty tech brand developing sensor-based skincare products that adapt in real time to each user's skin needs. SLM's story starts with Rouguiatou's own journey with acne and hyperpigmentation, which led her to dedicate more than seven years to researching the skincare industry. When it was time to launch her business and bring her vision to life, Rouguiatou reached out to VOLS. VOLS MEP and pro bono volunteers are supporting Rouguiatou in preparing the key legal documents needed to launch and safeguard her business. She also received intellectual property advice through a VOLS legal education workshop and clinic. "VOLS is helping me protect my

brand and bring my vision for inclusive, tech-driven skincare to life," said Rouguiatou.

62% of small business owners said they "lack the tools and resources to address the challenges their businesses face."





VOLS MEP provides free legal support on transactional matters including, advice on legal entity selection and formation, creating and maintaining governance documents, drafting and evaluating contracts, reviewing compliance with employment laws, and protecting intellectual property.



## VOLS Incarcerated Mothers Law Project

VOLS Incarcerated Mothers Law Project (IMLP) provides family law advice, advocacy and education to mothers and parents in and recently released from women's prison and jail in New York State. Most of the mothers we see have no other access to family law attorneys or legal advice. We help protect parental rights, arrange care for children, maintain family ties, and plan for successful reunification.





#### Ms. A's Story

VOLS IMLP's lawyers and pro bono partners can be a mother's only link to enforcement of her parental rights. Ms. A had sole custody of her child before she was incarcerated. She wished to continue the relationship with her daughter, which she was fully entitled to in a court order. Indeed, she was entitled to in-person visits, weekly video/phone calls, and independent access to medical and educational providers. Despite this, Ms. A was NEVER informed about where her child attended school or the name of her daughter's pediatrician. She received no updates on her child and has not had a call in almost two years. Our team is meeting with Ms. A regularly to work on enforcing her parental rights and working with her social worker to provide holistic care. Families like Ms. A and her daughter benefit significantly from having access to a family lawyer who can guide them through this process toward reunification.

VOLS IMLP is the only program in New York State that provides a full range of free family law support to help mothers access their rights and help families stay connected.

"It is estimated that 62% of incarcerated women in New York State are mothers of minor children (half of whom are nine years or younger)."

## **VOLS Children's Project**


VOLS Children's Project (CP) provides pro bono partner law firms with school- and hospital-based legal support to low-income children and families. Matters typically involve housing, public benefits, and immigration challenges that interfere with the child's health or education.

VOLS advocates for tenants when difficult landlords refuse to improve dangerous living conditions.

A young family from The Bronx had a child receiving treatment in the hospital when they met with the VOLS Children's Project clinic about their apartment. They weren't sure what to do—their apartment was filled with mold, leaks, and had a dangerous risk of lead poisoning for their child. To make matters worse, their landlord was on the city's notorious "Worst Landlord Watchlist." Although the family had pressed their landlord to resolve these serious health and safety concerns, the landlord claimed that the family had not allowed workers into the apartment.

The pro bono team at Cravath, Swaine & Moore LLP connected with VOLS' inhouse housing expert. VOLS provided crucial advice and preparatory material as the pro bono team diligently planned to take the landlord to court. The team's advocacy was so successful that the judge ordered the landlord to make the repairs after just the first hearing.

"Working with pro bono on Children's Project cases allows a family to address multiple issues at once. In this recent case involving a family's landlord, the judge was so compelled by our team's presentation on what had happened. We were so glad to help bring this family relief," Jean Stevens, Director of the VOLS Benefits Law Project.
